Information and guidance for the answers for the game cards

Farmer

- I work with all sorts of large machinery, power tools, and hand tools. I also have lighting all around the farm.
- I need to look out and up for electricity wires when I'm using farm machinery around the fields. I also have to think about underground electricity cables before I dig.
- If there isn't any electricity, I can't charge up any equipment or use the lights I need to keep my farm secure and the animals safe.

Builder

- I work on homes, businesses, and shops in the local community. I use power tools, digging machinery, and lighting.
- I need to check for electricity cables underground before I dig foundations and look up and check for electricity wires before using long objects like ladders and if I do any work indoors to make sure I keep everyone safe.
- If there isn't any electricity, I can't operate the equipment I need to complete the build.

Vet

- I work with lots of different pieces of equipment to help animals get better. I use x-ray machines, computers, telephones, and lighting as well as other equipment in the surgery.
- I need to make sure all my equipment is checked regularly.
- If there isn't any electricity, I struggle to help some animals and I may not be able to open my surgery.

Shopkeeper

- Lots of people visit my shop to buy their groceries. I have tills, lighting, CCTV, and storage – they all need electricity to work.
- I need to make sure all electricity cables are safe to make sure there are no trip hazards. I also need to make sure all my equipment is checked regularly to keep the food chilled and the customers safe.
- If there isn't any electricity, I can't open my shop.

Nurse

Did you know?

Hospitals and other medical facilities have power back up, such as their own electricity generators, to keep the electricity on during a power cut.

- I work in the community to keep my patients supported and safe. I have special equipment for some patients, which requires electricity.
- I need to think about any cables on the floor to make sure that no one has an accident and I need to get my equipment checked regularly to make sure it's safe.
- If there isn't any electricity, I find it more difficult to support my patients safely.

Neighbourhood watch

- I understand that my neighbours may need support in a power cut.
- I would be a primary contact for the emergency services to support my neighbours and the safety of the community.
- If isn't any electricity, I know where people could go to access the resources they need.

Campsite warden

- I work in the local area. My campsite has facilities such as toilet blocks and receptions – they need lighting, heating, and safety features (such as fire alarms).
- I need to make sure that people don't use long items like tent poles or light camp fires under overhead electricity wires. I need to think about underground cables before digging and make sure that tents aren't pitched near underground cables. I also need to make sure that there aren't any damaged electricity cables or equipment that people could hurt themselves on.
- If there isn't any electricity, I can't have any buildings open in the dark, I may not be able to use my booking system at the reception desk and campers can't use any electricity hook up points.

Teacher

- I work in the local area, teaching children from the ages of four. The school has lots of equipment that needs electricity to work, including alarms, phones, lights, and computers.
- I need to think about any cables lying on the floor to make sure that no one has an accident. I also need to get my electrical equipment checked regularly to make sure it's safe.
- If there isn't any electricity, I can't use the equipment I need in school to teach the children properly.

Find as many of these locations on the map as you can

- Doctors, veterinary surgeons, dentists, hospitals, and ambulance stations.
- Fire stations, police stations, garages, shopping centres, retail parks, and convenience stores.
- Main bus stops, railway stations, and local routes of buses and trains.
- Local Scout meeting places, public parks, theatres, sports and leisure complexes, and cinemas.
- Places of worship, museums, schools, colleges, community centres and local government buildings.
- Local routes that take you to the nearest motorway and national routes.
- Pylons and poles supporting overhead power lines and substations.
