Make a mode bunker

Fortify your squad's position at the crash site and protect your supplies

Suitable for Scouts

Mission: Stranded!

On a routine patrol, your squad of Space Marines has crash-landed on a planet. A dense jungle filled with swamps surrounds what little is left of their craft. Help may not arrive for some time, and although the planet scanned as uninhabited, other dangers may await in the humid depths of the wild.

Each Space Marine has collected some useful materials from the crash and the surrounding area. Using only these materials, work together to create a bunker to protect your supplies and communication beacon.

In your design, think about:

- How the squad will keep a lookout for danger
- How they can defend it
- How they will keep their supplies safe



Before you start

Download the activity sheet and templates from fundraising.scouts.org.uk/ Warhammer

Top tip: Use the jungle logs as posts to create a frame for the bunker.

You will need

- templates printed onto card
- scissors
- tape
- cardboard for the base

Instructions

- Split your group into different teams. Give each team a base to construct their bunker on.
- Give out one template per participating young person.

- Ask each young person to cut out their supplies and make their model following the instructions on the sheet.
- Read the mission to your Scouts and support them to discuss ideas for their bunker.
- Ask your Scouts to work together and create a bunker.
- When they have finished, get each group to present their finished bunker and discuss the benefits of each one.
