






# Airline markings and flags – answers and facts



Airline	Country	Fact
<p><b>British Airways</b></p> 	<p><b>United Kingdom</b></p> 	<p>British Airways was founded in 1974.</p>
<p><b>Emirates</b></p> 	<p><b>United Arab Emirates</b></p> 	<p>Emirates sponsor the Emirates Air Line cable car, which was built in 2011 over the River Thames in London.</p>
<p><b>Air France</b></p> 	<p><b>France</b></p> 	<p>The French flag is called the Tricolour (French: Tricolore) because it was one of the first countries to have a flag with three equal vertical bands of colour.</p>
<p><b>Swiss International Air Lines</b></p> 	<p><b>Switzerland</b></p> 	<p>The Red Cross was founded in Switzerland. The organisation's logo is the inverted Swiss national flag.</p>

<p><b>South African Airways</b></p> 	<p><b>South Africa</b></p> 	<p>In 1953, South African Airways was the first African airline to operate a passenger jet.</p>
<p><b>Air Canada</b></p> 	<p><b>Canada</b></p> 	<p>In 1963, Air Canada became the first airline in the world to operate a jet freighter (an all-cargo aircraft).</p>
<p><b>Korean Air</b></p> 	<p><b>South Korea</b></p> 	<p>The South Korean flag is called the Taegukgi. The Taegeuk is the symbol in the middle of the flag and means 'supreme ultimate'.</p>
<p><b>Uganda Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Uganda</b></p> 	<p>Uganda Airlines stopped operating in 2001 because of low funds, but was revived in 2019 and is back running after 18 years.</p>
<p><b>Austrian Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Austria</b></p> 	<p>The arrow symbol on the Austrian Airlines logo represents a flying bird.</p>
<p><b>Croatia Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Croatia</b></p> 	<p>The symbol in the middle of the Croatian flag is Croatia's coat of arms. It is informally known as 'šahovnica' in Croatian, which means 'chessboard'.</p>

<p><b>Nepal Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Nepal</b></p> 	<p>The flag of Nepal is the only national flag in the world that is not a rectangle. It is made up of two triangles overlapping each other.</p>
<p><b>Turkish Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Turkey</b></p> 	<p>Turkish Airlines flies to 122 countries, more than any other airline in the world.</p>
<p><b>Air Seychelles</b></p> 	<p><b>Seychelles</b></p> 	<p>The birds on the airline markings are terns. Terns are the national bird of Seychelles.</p>
<p><b>Aer Lingus</b></p> 	<p><b>Republic of Ireland</b></p> 	<p>The Aer Lingus logo is a shamrock, a three-leaved clover. It is symbol associated with St Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland.</p>
<p><b>Qantas Airways</b></p> 	<p><b>Australia</b></p> 	<p>The Qantas logo is a kangaroo, which is an animal native to Australia. The airline is nicknamed 'The Flying Kangaroo'.</p>
<p><b>Fiji Airways</b></p> 	<p><b>Fiji</b></p> 	<p>The symbol on Fiji Airways' logo is the Teteva and the border is Makare. These are inspired by traditional Fijian Masi art motifs.</p>

<p><b>Air Tanzania</b></p> 	<p><b>Tanzania</b></p> 	<p>The Air Tanzania logo has the image of a giraffe on it, which is Tanzania's national emblem.</p>
<p><b>Aeroméxico</b></p> 	<p><b>Mexico</b></p> 	<p>The symbol on the Aeroméxico marking is the Eagle Knight emblem. This is a symbol of courage, leadership, and fearlessness and is inspired by ancient Aztec culture.</p>
<p><b>Caribbean Airlines</b></p> 	<p><b>Trinidad and Tobago</b></p> 	<p>The bird on the Caribbean Airlines markings is a hummingbird. Trinidad and Tobago was known as 'Land of the Hummingbird' by its native people.</p>
