You can have confidence in yourself, when you know you're doing your best to do the right thing. It's important to respecting other people's backgrounds, especially when they're different from yours.






Why do Scouts shake hands with their left hand?


Baden-Powell started the tradition. We think he took it from African warriors who used it to show trust and respect – to shake hands with their left hand, they had to put down their shields.
