Risk Assessment is a process not a document. All workers should be trained and familiar with relevant hazards and controls identified in this document. It is good practice for workers to "sign off" that they understand and accept the safe system of work detailed in this document and any associated Operating Procedures / Method statements.

Serious complaint or behavioural issue concerning a guest	Guests, Staff	Low	Duty Manager and Event manager on call throughout the event to manage customer service type issues. Senior TSA management present on site to support if needed.	Low

Large bins placed at key locations around the site Waste to be taken to compactor and managed by trained volunteers as per usual operation. Regular site walks to be conducted by event management team including the Safety officer.	Low

Severity Factor & Remaining Risk Assessment

Level	Severity Description	Residual Risk Description
Low.	Minor Injury requiring no treatment, or simple first aid.	Control shave reduced the severity and/or likelihood of occurrence to minimal levels.
Medium.	Injury would require the participant/worker to stop continuing the activity/task; medical treatment is beyond the skills of a basic first aider.	Control measures have reduced severity and/or likelihood to an adequate level but hazard still requires dynamic risk assessment & conscious consideration.
High.	Injury would require expert medical attention and/or result in fatality.	Control measures are not sufficient to reduce the severity or likelihood to an acceptable level.
