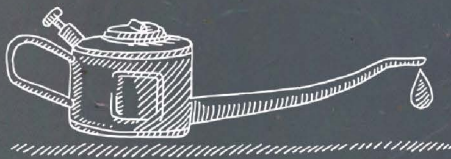


The Fix-it Quiz
