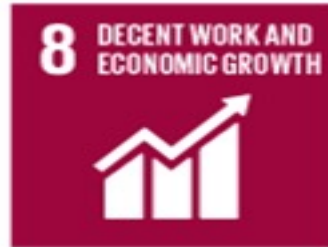


Lily addressed period poverty during the Covid pandemic by making reusable sanitary towels which reduced plastic waste. These towels were distributed in Yorkshire and across East Africa. Lily also worked to educate and inspire others about the challenges surrounding period poverty.





Bailey, Emma and Dani set up a goat farm in Uganda which gave a living wage to local people and generated a surplus which funded teachers who taught at the local school providing quality education to many children.





Emily worked to improve an area outside her Scout Hut to make it a place where children could learn about nature and sustainability. As a result of Emily's project, more wildlife now live in the grounds of the Scout Hut.





During the first Covid lockdown, Ammar set up a food bank in his community which fed hundreds of people who needed support during the pandemic. He put a plan together for the food bank to continue serving the community upon the completion of his project.





Luke, Tom and Michael fundraised and built a toilet block for a school in Malawi. The school is ran by a UK Charity and the new toilets improved the access to good quality sanitary facilities for hundreds of children.





Daniel (centre) worked in his local community to increase the number of bees by renovating land to make it bee friendly. He also educated others about bees. Daniel (who is autistic) has also inspired other young people with additional needs that they too can complete their award.





Ben and Emily (both right) worked with a Primary School in East Yorkshire to improve the environment around the grounds by planting trees and creating an environment for insects to thrive. They improved the education that 200 children receive in an outdoor setting.

- The King's Scout is the Top Achievement for Explorers and Scout Network
- You have to be over 16 to start the award
- Requirements
 - 18 nights away, 12 of these must be camping
 - Six activities from the [International Community Values List](#)
 - Take up a Skill, Physical Activity and Service for 12 months and show progress and lasting interest
 - Undertake an Expedition...
- Make a Presentation covering all of your work to a suitable audience, focussing on inspiring others to work on the KSA

King's / Queen's Scout Award Expedition

- Undertake training, a practice expedition and four day, three-night self-led final expedition
 - This should include a project
- Training should include;
 - first aid,
 - risk assessment,
 - Navigation & the highway code
 - cooking,
 - team building,
 - looking after camp equipment
 - proficiency in mode of travel.

King's / Queen's Scout Award Residential



- Undertake a five-day, four-night residential project in an unfamiliar environment with people that you don't know.
- The project could be environmental work, project-based, service to others or personal training
- This can be done over two weekends in exceptional circumstances.
- If you need any flexibility with the award, reach out to us and we can help with finding guidance, to make sure it's accessible

- **IST members:** we will contact you directly about payments in the next few weeks.

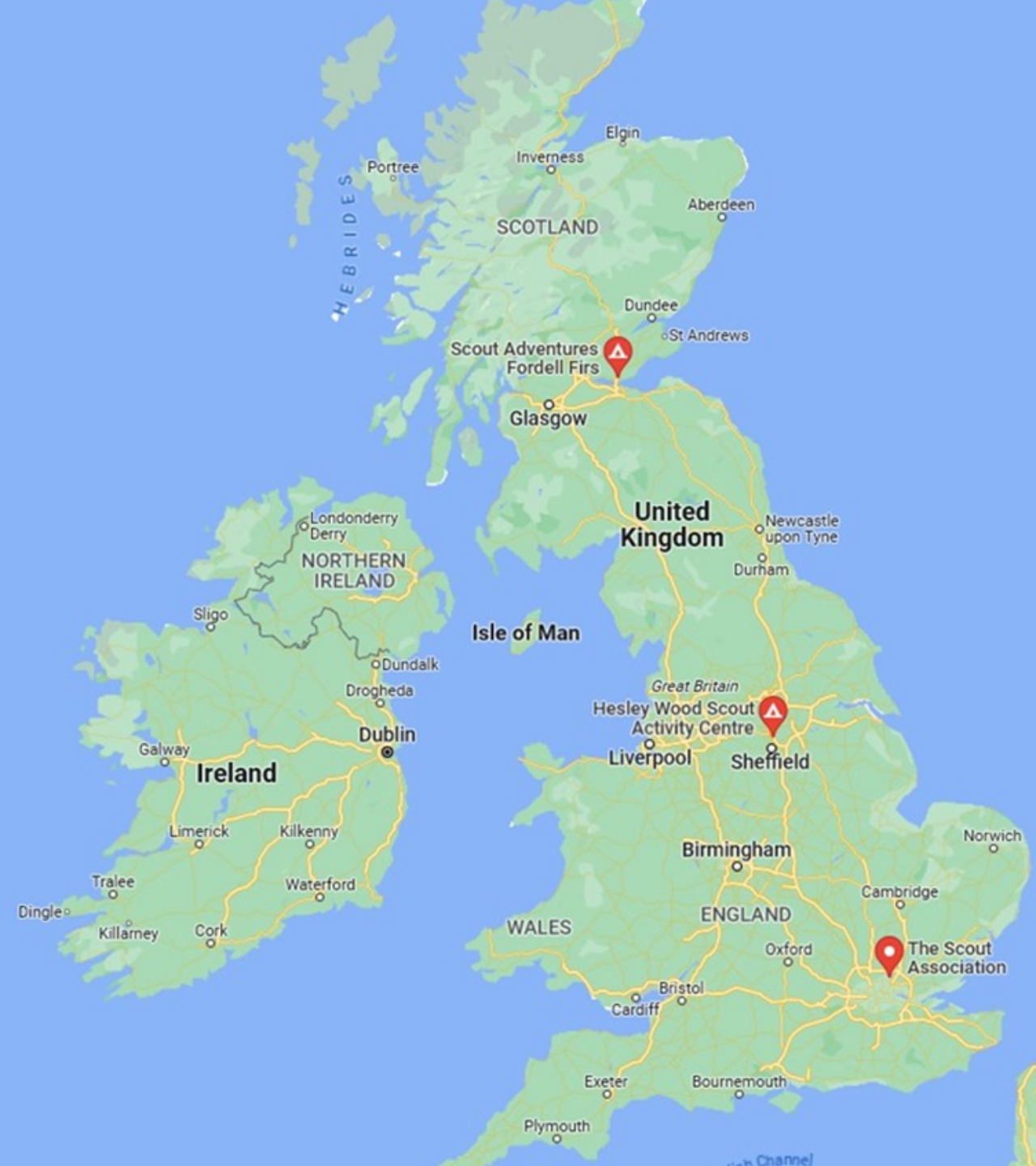
Grants
